

Your application was selected by the U.S. Department of Education (DOE) for a process called "Verification". Regulations state schools have the right to ask for this information before awarding financial aid. If there are any differences between the information on your FAFSA and the information provided for verification, corrections may need to be submitted to DOE. Your financial aid cannot be processed until the verification process is complete, so turn these documents in as soon as possible.

DIRECTIONS:

1. Make a copy of your (and spouse's, if married and filed separately) 2007 federal tax forms (1040's, W-2's, 1099's, etc.) and refer to them when completing this form. If you are separated or divorced, but filed jointly in 2007, please submit a copy of both your 2007 Federal tax forms AND your w-2's. If you did not keep a copy of your tax return, you can request a copy from the IRS by calling (800)829-1040.
2. Complete this worksheet answering ALL questions - do not leave questions blank. If the answer is "Zero", enter a "0".
3. Sign this worksheet on page 2.
4. Staple the copies of all of your (and spouse's) 2007 federal tax forms to this worksheet. These copies must be signed.
5. Submit this verification worksheet and 2007 federal tax forms to the Financial Aid Office.

\$	Untaxed portions of pensions from IRS Form 1040-lines (16a - 16b) or 1040A-lines (12a - 12b). Exclude rollovers. If negative, enter a zero.
\$	Credit for federal tax on special fuels from IRS Form 4136-line 18 (non-farmers only)
\$	Housing, food, and other living allowances paid to members of the military, clergy, and others (including cash payments and cash value of benefits)
\$	Veterans noneducation benefits such as Disability, Death Pension, or Dependency & Indemnity Compensation (DIC) and/or VA Educational Work-Study allowances
